Day 1:

A church does the work of God together. Churches meet to learn more about God, Jesus and the Bible.


A church plans to tell other people about Jesus. Churches have different ways of doing the work of God. Churches meet in many different kinds of buildings, but a church is not a building.

The book of Acts tells the story of the very first Christian church. A group of believers were together, and God sent the Holy Spirit to them. The Holy Spirit helped Peter to stand up and tell a big crowd of people about Jesus, and many people believed and repented. Then, the new believers were baptized and joined with the other believers to make the first church. The first church and the church today are made up of people who have trusted Jesus and Saviour.

Read Luke 11:5-13

All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.


A Pray it

Think about who God is, and the joy and the hope that we have in Him.


Pray that God will help you (and everyone at church!) to be an encouragement to others today!



Jesus gave specific instructions for his followers. Match each shape to a letter to find out what every baptised believer in the church should do.







Day 3:

Read | Corinthians 12:12-26

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptised by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.


Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body.

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honoured, every part rejoices with it.
