When was the last time you had exciting news that you could not wait to tell someone? Have your parents ever told you something and then told you not to tell anyone? It's hard to keep a secret when you want to tell someone.

Living the Christian life should not be a secret! Since you have become a Christian, you should tell others about Jesus. Your testimony is important! No one else has a story like yours.

The story of how you became a Christian and what God has done in your life is your testimony. When you tell others how you became a Christian, you are sharing your testimony!



A MISSIONARY is a person whom God calls in a special way to tell others about Jesus.

TESTIMONY means telling about your experience of what God has done in your life.

Read 2 Thessalonians 1:10

"When he comes on that day, he will receive glory from his holy people—praise from all who believe. And this includes you, for you believed what we told you about him."

Day 2:


Read John 4:1-30, and 39-42

Day 3:


Read John 14:16


